Making Musical Instruments

How to make a shaker:

- Find a strong, medium sized, Y shaped stick
- Tie smooth string or wire on one side of the Y at the top
- Thread about 5 or 6 buttons through the string/wire
- Tie the string/wire on the other side of the Y at the top so it is taught
- Shake!



How to make a rain stick:

- Find an empty plastic bottle with a lid
- Search for small sticks that will fit inside the bottle
- Fill the bottle with small sticks, shaking it occasionally, until you can't fit any more in
- Pour in some dry rice, seeds or dry pulses (use a funnel if you have one) but leave enough room for the rice to move between the sticks
- Put the lid on the bottle and slowly turn the bottle around and upside down to hear your rain stick!
